December 21st is the Winter Solstice, the longest night of the year. The National Coalition for the Homeless designates it "National Homeless Persons" Memorial Day." On this day, WHEEL (a grassroots organizing effort) and Mary's Place (an ecumenical ministry) will stand a special one-hour, candlelight, Women in Black vigil to remember all the homeless men and women who have died this year outside or by violence in King County.

Since our vigils began almost 15 years ago, more than 600 men, women and children have died outside or by violence. In 2015, we've broken our hearts and all previous records: at least 60 people have died already—at the average age of 48 years old.
