December 21st is the Winter Solstice, the longest night of the year.

The National Coalition for the Homeless designates it "National Homeless Persons' Memorial Day." On this day, WHEEL (a grassroots organizing effort) will stand a special one-hour, candlelight, Women in Black vigil to remember all the homeless men and women who have died this year outside or by violence in King County.

Since our vigils began nearly 20 years ago, more than 1,000 men, women and children have died outside or by violence. In 2019, we've broken our hearts: at least 109 people have died outside, in a public place or by violence (of 153 people on the Medical Examiners' presumed-homeless list through early December).

Please join us for our Women in Black Solstice activities, starting at sunset (4:20 PM) at our Tree of Life! Women and men are welcome; candles are provided, and we'll join together for a post-vigil gathering to share stories, fellowship and comfort!
