Leaves of Remembrance bear the names of homeless women and men who’ve died, so that every person will have a place to be remembered. At the sites where bronze Leaves are installed we are called to recognize and honor those who’ve died, and to make known the crisis facing so many in our community. Each Leaf has ‘fallen’ from the bronze **Tree of Life**, a sculpture and gathering place at Victor Steinbrueck Park (north of Pike Place Market). Since 2003, **The Homeless Remembrance Project** – a collaborative community effort facilitated by the homeless women of WHEEL – has created these places of hope, healing, and beauty to honor and remember people who’ve experienced homelessness who’ve died in King County.
